Appendix A

Proposed language from lobbyist representing Thompson Elevator Inspection Service, Inc, Suburban Building Officials Conference (SBOC), Northwest Building Officials and Code Administrators (NWBOCA), IL Firefighter's Association, and IL Professional Firefighters Association:

"Temporary certificate of operation" means a temporary certificate of operation issued by the Administrator or the Local Administrator that permits the temporary use of a conveyance by the general public for a limited time of 30 days while minor repairs or upgrades are being completed; and 1) as applicable, the Firefighters' Emergency Operation and Car Emergency Signal code requirements, as referenced by the most current edition of ASME A17.1 section 8.10, and ASME A18.1 section 10, adopted by the Administrator in administrative rules. and 2) it is determined by the Administrator or Local Administrator that the conveyance's use will not jeopardize the safety and health of those using or working on the conveyance. If, after 30 days, an additional inspection of the conveyance determines the same required criteria 1) and 2) as noted above, no more than one additional 30-day extension to the certificate may be granted.

Please Note: This language is a proposal of language from a set of stakeholders to the Elevator Safety Review Board (Board) for consideration on the topic of temporary certificate of operation and temporary use. This language is currently not endorsed by the Administrator (OSFM).
