## INTRODUCTION

This task book is the evaluation tool used to validate the member's proficiency in the skills required to complete the Fire Department Health and Safety Officer recertification program. The National Fire Protection Agency (NFPA) 1521: *Standard for Fire Department Safety Officer Professional Qualifications* (2020 Edition) has specified Job Performance Requirements (JPRs) required by individuals to comply with Chapter 4. JPRs provide an individual completing a task with the necessary data to determine when the task is finished and indicate how well the individual performed.

### INITIAL STATE CERTIFICATION PREREQUISITES

All rules relating to the Fire Department Health and Safety Officer certification can be found in the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR) Section 141.313.

- 1. Current certification as Company Fire Officer.
- 2. Successful completion of a Fire Department Health and Safety Officer course (minimum of 40 hours).
- 3. Passage of the State Written Examination.

### **RECERTIFICATION PROCESS**

Each JPR must be completed at least one time to successfully recertify at this level. Members are encouraged to track additional completions as a way of tracking additional training in this area.

The complete recertification process can be found in JCAR Section 141.390 Recertifications.
